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Dear Students and Parents,

WELCOME to the 9th year of DANCEARTS YOUTH COMPANY, and heartfelt congratulations to all the students who have been accepted for the 2023-2024 DAYCO season. In the fall of 2014, DanceArts Greenville successfully launched its DANCEARTS YOUTH COMPANY. DAYCO developed out of the original DanceArts Enrichment Programs entitled Ensemble and Staged, which were started in 2010. These programs provided our Intermediate and Advanced students with specialized Saturday morning & early afternoon dance study.

DAYCo continues to offer pre-professional dance training in technique, choreography, and performance artistry. In addition to this, we introduced the Competition Track, providing opportunities for students to compete at prestigious events like YAGP (Youth American Grand Prix) and Grand Jeté (South Carolina Governors School for the Arts and Humanities). Entry into the Competition Track is based on audition scores and formative assessments through-out the dance season by our DAYCo directors and staff. It is important to note that this level requires summer ballet training in a summer intensive and/or camps.

We have structured DAYCo into four company levels: Elites, Trainees, Festival, and Advanced. Each level also includes a Competition Track that allows students to learn, workshop, perfect, and perform a Classical ballet solo in a ballet competition. After completing one year in the Competition Track, students become eligible to add a Contemporary solo to their repertoire. Throughout the DAYCo season, the focus will be on Progressing Ballet Technique, Ballet class, and Repertoire in Classical and Contemporary dance, with a Lyrical/Jazz focus.

To kick off the season, we are hosting a DAYCo summer camp from July 31st to August 3rd. During this camp, our full company will participate in classes, receive photos for the season, get their dance kits and required items, and most importantly, bond and build camaraderie for the season ahead. If you have any questions about summer training for your DAYCo dancer, please don't hesitate to reach out to us; we are here to assist you.

Once again, welcome to the 2023-2024 DAYCO season. We look forward to an inspiring and rewarding journey with each and every one of you.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

At DanceArts Greenville, we want a nurturing, supportive, and safe artistic learning environment. As student role models for the greater DanceArts community, we ask that all DAYCO students read and follow the following set of guidelines.

PUNCTUALITY & ATTENDANCE POLICY

Consistent attendance is vital in maintaining a student's mastery of dance technique. Dance is a physical activity that requires consistent weekly training to establish muscle strength and muscle memory. Classical ballet training is a highly specialized technique that requires excellent instruction by a knowledgeable teacher and committed attendance by the student in order to achieve the desired results. Please show respect to your teachers and fellow students by arriving on time for your classes and rehearsals.

Foreseen absences should be emailed in advance to Office@DanceArtsGreenville.com as early as possible, so that teachers and choreographers can plan accordingly. In the case of an emergency, illness, or unavoidable absence on Saturday, we ask students or parents/guardians call our studio first at 864-297-1635, if you cannot get Ms. Marialuz, call Ms.Anita cell phone at 864-498-8949 or email Office@DanceArtsGreenville.com.

ARRIVING EARLY AND PREPARING FOR CLASS:

Students will get the maximum benefit from ballet class if they arrive early (15 minutes before) and are mentally and physically prepared for class. These minutes before class should be used to stretch or think about the exercises you did in the last class in the studio, they have their first class. Do not "hang-out" in dressing room.

REPORTING INJURY

DanceArts Greenville is committed to the safety and well being of all students. We expect students to take responsibility for their physical condition, report injuries, and not risk their health to participate in the program. Student should report to their teacher and the teacher will hand the student an **Observation Form** to be filled out while the student is observing class/rehearsal. The form will be available by the DAYCO board.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Cell phones and other telecommunications devices, such as iPads, iPad minis, iPods, AirPods, etc., should be kept on silent mode and stored in bags or dressing rooms during dance classes. It is essential to maintain a respectful and focused environment for all students. In the case where the use of an electronic device is necessary for reviewing dance-related tasks, students must seek permission from their instructor before doing so. This ensures that disruptions are minimized and everyone can fully immerse themselves in the learning experience.

SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY and CONDUCT

If you are a DAYCo dancer with a "dance" focused Instagram account, it's essential to follow the guidelines set by DanceArts Greenville. When posting images or videos from DAYCo sessions, make sure to represent DAYCo's mission appropriately and give proper credit to the choreographers and music used in the content. Additionally, if DanceArts or DAYCo-themed events are taking place, remember to tag @danceartsgville in your posts to show support and affiliation with the organization. Always conduct yourself in a respectful and professional manner, both inside and outside of the studio, as you represent DanceArts Greenville at all times. Social media can be a powerful tool for showcasing your passion for dance and connecting with others who share similar interests, so use it responsibly and positively.

CARE FOR FACILITY & EQUIPMENT

- 1. Students are expected to respectfully use and care for buildings, grounds, and equipment in a proper manner.
- 2. Students are expected to keep dressing rooms neat and clean, and to clean up after themselves in the cafeteria and dressing rooms.
- 3. Vandalism or graffiti of any kind on DanceArts property or another person's property is not allowed.

DRESS CODE

Proper grooming, hygiene, and appearance is essential to the growing Dance Artist and a disciplined artistic environment.

- 1. Students should wear their DAYCO monogrammed leotard (Wear Moi Faustine style tank in Black, convertible pink tights, and class-specific shoes) Leotard-\$40.
- 2. **Jewelry** can be dangerous in dance. In order to be safe for the dancer and her partners, only jewelry that is permitted are small earrings, rings and a thin non-dangle necklace. No FitBits, Apple Watches, Friendship bracelets or any kind of other additional bracelets.
- 3. For Progressing Ballet Technique, students can wear socks or bare feet, trash bag shorts
- 4. Students should wear warm-ups/clothing over their dancewear as they enter and leave the building. We will be selling our DAYCO jackets and will have sample sizes to try on pre-season. The jackets are \$55.
- 5. Students should not wear PJ bottoms, hoodies, loose button-down shirts, cut off tights. If an instructor allows you to keep warm-ups on the first part of class, please place them out of the way when removing.

NON-DISCRIMINATION/NON-HARASSMENT:

DanceArts Greenville is dedicated to the treatment of all persons with respect and dignity and to providing an environment that is free from any form of discrimination or harassment. The matter will be dealt with on a confidential basis with disclosure only to the extent necessary for fair problem resolution and only to those who have an immediate need to know.

ALCOHOL & DRUGS POLICY

- 1. Smoking or vaping is not permitted on DanceArts property or grounds.
- 2. No student, regardless of age, will possess, use, sell, purchase, barter, distribute, or be under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance.
- 3. Possession of drugs, alcohol and tobacco is not allowed.

STUDENT TEACHING ASSISTANT POSITIONS

DAYCO dancers can volunteer to be in the **Student Assistant Mentor Program (Festival and Competition Track only)**. This is a completely volunteer position and is great for students who need community service volunteer hours for school or extracurricular activities. As student role models for the greater DanceArts community, we ask that you demonstrate the behavior and etiquette of a good student. You will assist the teacher in a class and develop positive relationships with the students. DRESS CODE: DAYCO leotard, pink tights, ballet shoes and hair in bun. Elite tuition = \$630 per dancer (Elite: Must be in Ballet 4A, attend the full ballet curriculum and enrolled in Jazz and/or Lyrical.)

One – three sessions per month: September - April 17 training sessions

Payments options:

- 1. September one-time payment of \$630
- 2. September and January payments of \$315
- 3. Monthly payments of \$70

Trainee tuition = \$630 per dancer (Trainee: Must be in Ballet 5B, attend the full ballet curriculum and enrolled in Jazz/Lyrical)

One – three sessions per month: September - April 17 training sessions

Payments options:

- 1. September one-time payment of \$630
- 2. September and January payments of \$315
- 3. Monthly payments of \$70

Festival A/B tuition = \$900 per dancer (Must be in Ballet 5A or higher, attend the full ballet curriculum and enrolled in Jazz/Lyrical)
Two – three sessions per month: September - April

<u>Elite and Trainee Classical Competition YAGP and/or Grand Jeté track tuition</u> = \$850 per dancer (Must be in Ballet level 4A or higher, attend the full ballet curriculum and enrolled in Jazz/Lyrical.)

27 training sessions between September and April for YAGP/Grand Jeté *This track is by invitation only.*

Payment options:

- 1. September one-time payment of \$850
- 2. September and January payments of \$425 each
- 3. Monthly payments (September through May) of \$94 per month
